Make your own dinosaur fossil footprint cookies with this simple cookie recipe

What you'll need:

3 cups all-purpose flour (plus more for rolling)

1 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. salt

1 cup butter, softened

1 cup granulated sugar

1 large egg

1 tsp. pure vanilla extract

1 tbsp. milk



Toy dinosaur (cleaned in warm soapy water)

Directions:

In a large bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, and salt.

In another large bowl, using a hand mixer (or in the bowl of a stand mixer), beat butter and sugar until fluffy and pale in colour. Add egg, milk, and vanilla and beat until combined, then add flour mixture gradually until totally combined.


Roll tablespoon sized pieces of dough into balls and place onto a greased baking tray, or tray lined with baking paper, then stamp a dinosaur foot into each ball of cookie dough using the toy dinosaur.

Refrigerate for 1 hour. When ready to bake, preheat oven to 180°C.

Bake for 15-17 minutes, or until golden.
